Our Journey

Originating in 2021 as a BRISSC 8 week program, called First Nations Women's Healing Cultural Program and facilitated by Aunty Sharyn Malone. Drawing on the success of the program Aunty Sharyn, Aunty Chantay Link, Aunty Dawn Daylight & Uraine Roelofs worked to keep the program going. The group was named Ya'djin Yadoo Wunggu which translates to Speak Beautiful Talk in Kabi Kabi & Kokatha Languages. Since 2021 the group has continued to meet & deliver activities across South East Queensland & to create safe spaces for women & children experiencing or healing from sexual, domestic &/or family violence.

In 2023 the group decided to work on their governance structure to better meet the needs of the women they serve and to create stronger ally-ship with their sponsors BRISSC and overarching governance body the Women's Community Aid Association (WCAA). This led to the decision to change the name to Ya'djin Women's Collective.Ya'din is a place for women to speak, to find their voice and to be heard.
