Our Journey

Originating in 2021 as an 8 week program, facilitated by Aunty Sharyn Malone, with support from Aunty Chantay Link, Aunty Dawn Daylight & other women who fought to keep the program going and to hold space. Since 2021 the group has continued to meet & deliver activities across South East Queensland & to create safe spaces for women & children experiencing or healing from family, domestic &/or sexual violence.

In 2023 the group decided to work on their governance structure to better meet the needs of the women they serve and to create stronger ally-ship with our aspiring body the Women's Community Aid Association (WCAA) which includes BRISSC & The Women's Shelter.

Ya'din means "speak" in Kabi Kabi language and our collective is a place for women to speak, to find their voice and to be heard.
